Visit to Haynes Motor Museum at Sparkford - Thursday 26th July

We are proposing to organise a visit to the world renowned Haynes International Motor museum on Thurs 26th July. The Museum is the UK's largest collection of the greatest cars from around the world with over 400 amazing cars and bikes from the dawn of motoring in the late 1800s through nostalgic classics of the 1950s and 1960s, glorious Bentleys and Rolls Royces to world renowned super cars like the Jaguar XJ220. As the museum is about 76 miles from Fairford it is suggested that using modern cars for the trip would be most suitable.
