How to keep your money in your pocket and keep points off your licence

From March 1st if you get caught using a mobile phone while in charge of a motor vehicle the fine has risen to £200 with 6 points on your licence.

From 24th. April new fines will come into force for speeding offences

Speed limit (mph)	Recorded speed (mph)		
20	41 and above	31-40	21-30
30	51 and above	41-50	31-40
40	66 and above	56-65	41-55
50	76 and above	66-75	51-65
60	91 and above	81-90	61-80
70	101 and above	91-100	71-90
Sentencing range	Band C fine (150% of relevant weekly income)	Band B fine (100% of relevant weekly income)	Band A fine (50% of relevant weekly income)
Points/disqualification	Disqualification for 7-56 days OR 6 points on your licence	Disqualification for 7-28 days OR 4-6 points on your licence	3 points on your licence
